LUMS Community Comes Together Amidst Pandemic

The LUMS COVID-19 Campaign was initiated in April 2020 with a target to raise and disburse PKR 50 million to support LUMS students and staff members in need, and individuals from the community at large who are struggling with food insecurity and health emergencies as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. To date, over 500 donors have come forward and contributed PKR 15,903,374.

Out of these donations, PKR 10 million was contributed by Syed Babar Ali, Founding Pro Chancellor. Furthermore, LUMS staff members also played an active role in supporting the campaign: Dr. Arshad Ahmad, Vice Chancellor, contributed PKR 1 million, while Dr. Kamran Asdar Ali, Interim Provost, contributed PKR 500,000.

LUMS students and alumni have also actively participated

and reached out to people in need, especially the daily wage earners who have lost their jobs due to the lockdown. Another noteworthy gesture is that MBM staff members, LUMS Pepsi Dining Centre staff, security guards, and classroom staff have come forward and contributed PKR 130,600 to the fund to help people in need.

So far, a total of PKR 12,460,000 has been disbursed benefitting 1500 families and individuals. Of this amount, LUMS has disbursed a total of PKR 2,680,000 to students facing financial hardships. PKR 7,975,000 has gone to support members of staff, MBM and daily wage earners at the university and PKR 1,805,000 to members of the community at large through various student and alumni-led initiatives. LUMS has also joined hands with Rizq during the COVID-19 crisis. Rizq is a social

organisation established by three friends who came together during their time at LUMS to set up Pakistan's first food recovery and distribution service.

The LUMS COVID-19 Campaign extended finanical support to relief efforts undertaken by Rizq. The contribution was marked with a ceremony held on May 21, 2020 where Dr. Arshad Ahmad, Co-founders of Rizq, Mr. Huzaifa Ahmad, Mr. Musa Aamir and Mr. Qasim Javaid, and Rizq's Brand Ambassador and Tennis player, Mr. Aisam-ul-Haq Qureshi were present.

Bank of Punjab Signs MoU with LUMS to Enhance Employee Capabilities

Babar Ali Foundation Supports LUMS

Syed Babar Ali, Founding Pro Chancellor, LUMS, is recognised for his immeasurable generosity towards education and in promoting social equity within Pakistan. He, through the Babar Ali Foundation, has contributed extensively to many ventures at LUMS too.

Recently he has donated PKR 10 million towards the LUMS COVID-19 Campaign towards both staff and student support, and PKR 12 million as part of his annual contribution towards the School of Science

and Engineering. He also established an endowment worth PKR 60 million in the names of his sisters, late Syeda Kishwar Sultan, late Syeda Sarwat Sultan and Syeda Sitwat Mohsin. The returns on these funds will be used to sponsor three National Outreach Programme scholars for an indefinite period. He also contributed PKR 85 million to create three endowment funds in the memory of his late brothers, Syed Amjad Ali, Syed Wajid Ali and Syed Afzal Ali.

Mr. Abbas also served as the Vice President of the Asian Tennis Federation (ATF) and also headed its constitution committee.



DAAS Foundation Sponsors NOP Scholar



DAAS Foundation, an NGO committed towards providing support for education to families affected by terrorism in Pakistan, has collaborated with LUMS to sponsor a National Outreach Programme scholar.

Their trustee, Mr. Imran Naqvi, donated an amount of USD 6,500 on behalf of DAAS Foundation. In line with their mission, they want the amount to be utilised towards a child of a martyr, or a child affected by terrorism in

the country. Their objective is to provide quality education to families of individuals who have sacrificed their lives for Pakistan.



BSc Class of 2010 Sets Up Endowment Fund to Honour Classmates

The graduates of BSc Class of 2010 have successfully raised PKR 14 million for the Waheeb and Rafia BSc Class of 2010 Endowment Fund. It is named in honour of their classmates, Mr. Waheeb Alam and Ms. Rafia Amber, both of whom have passed away.

The endowment will be used to provide a 100% tuition fee waiver for one underprivileged undergraduate scholar for an indefinite period. The MoU between LUMS and representatives of the BSc Class of 2010 was initially signed on June 21, 2017, and since then,

the Fund has received generous contributions from well-wishers all around the world, including LUMS alumni and their friends and families.



WHY YOUR DONATION MATTERS

For over three decades, our donors have supported the University's mission of providing world-class education to meritorious students, regardless of their socio-economic status. Your generosity has enabled LUMS to invest in groundbreaking research, and also become a learner-centred institution through donations in infrastructure. Here are a few reasons why your gift matters:

Inclusive and Accessible Education for all

LUMS is a not-for-profit institution, with a strong focus on providing need-blind admissions based on merit. One in three students at LUMS is on financial aid, and we have disbursed almost PKR 7 billion through scholarships and the National Outreach Programme (NOP) since inception. The University conducts sessions to create awareness of its programmes in underserved areas throughout the country. In 2019-20 alone, LUMS approached 27,000 potential applicants in over 280 institutions and 80 cities. Based on our assessment of a student's financial need, we offer full tuition fee waivers, and also provide living stipends and any additional costs for books, lab charges, hostel fee, etc. Applicants are also provided extra coaching as well as financial support for standardised tests. We believe that access to education can break generational cycles of poverty for families and communities.

■ Immeasurable Impact on Business and Society in Pakistan

We have over 300 world-class faculty members contributing to global research and industry linkages. LUMS is involved in groundbreaking research; its centres are working in areas ranging from water, energy, and big data to indigenous languages and public policy. This year alone, there were a series of prestigious publications across all our schools. The Biomechanics Lab at the Syed Babar Ali School of Science and Engineering (SBASSE) earned accreditation from ICC, making it the fifth in the world to earn such an accolade. Furthermore, SBASSE has also been collaborating with different organisations to make contributions within the energy sector. The Shaikh Ahmad Hassan School of Law (SAHSOL) inaugurated the first Centre for Chinese Legal Studies in Pakistan in alliance with the School of Law at Wuhan University in China. The Syed Ahsan Ali and Syed Maratib Ali School of Education (SOE) has also been involved in multiple partnerships, conferences, panel discussions, and leadership programmes to make an impact in the educational landscape of the country.

■ LUMS Alumni Serve as Agents of Change

Our 14,000 strong alumni play a prominent role in contributing towards the development of the community. LUMS alumni have seen great success, and make up the single highest group of Fulbright scholars in the world from any one university. Our graduates have also consistently scored the highest marks in the CSS examinations in Pakistan. Furthermore, they have shown a passionate commitment to serve those less fortunate than us.
