## **Notable Gifts**

#### Founder of Stacks Donates 5 Million STX Tokens

Dr. Muneeb Ali (BSc 2003), Founder of the Stacks project (formerly, Blockstack) and CEO of Hiro, has donated 5 million STX tokens (equivalent to PKR 670 million or USD 4.1 million). This amount will be used to develop academic

programmes that will focus on emerging markets to create a practical learning environment for faculty and students. LUMS will use this funding to train the next generation of scholars, engineers and entrepreneurs through new interdisciplinary programmes in this area.

Dr. Ali lauded LUMS as a hub of cutting-edge research and innovations, "I am proud to have a long association with the Syed Babar Ali School of Science and Engineering. Crypto networks are likely the biggest tech revolution since the internet itself. This new collaboration on crypto not just strengthens my association with LUMS but can prepare the next generation of engineers and entrepreneurs to architect advancements in internet by leveraging the blockchain technology."

Dr. Arshad Ahmad, Vice Chancellor, LUMS, said, "Hiro's gift to LUMS is also a gift to the country since it is targeted to develop research and educational programmes on blockchain technology. With data privacy and data ownership becoming some of the defining issues of our time, LUMS can elevate the pioneering work underway in this area."



### Babar Ali Foundation Funds New Women's Hostel at LUMS

The Babar Ali Foundation recently gifted PKR 350 million for a new hostel at LUMS. The new building will be able to accommodate an additional 504 female students on campus. LUMS Founding Pro Chancellor, Syed Babar Ali has previously funded the other five female hostels on campus through the Foundation.

The new 500-bed facility will

have a covered area of 100,000 square feet, and 252 rooms with modern facilities and lounges.

Talking about the new space, Syed Babar Ali said, "Women are key partners in our country's growth and prosperity. There was a pressing need for additional accommodation for females and this hostel will allow more women to be housed and educated at the University. It is hoped that female graduates from LUMS will not only play a pivotal role in the private and public sectors, equivalent to their male counterparts, but also contribute to gender equality and inclusion in Pakistan."

### Lady Viqarun Nisa Noon Endowment Fund Set Up

A former National Assembly member from Jhang, Punjab, she also served as Pakistan's Ambassador to the United States and as the Federal Minister for Education, Science and Technology; Food and Agriculture; Population Welfare and Environment and Urban Affairs.

Ms. Hussain shared that contributing towards the advancement of higher education is one of the primary missions of the Trust. "We have full trust that the scholarships will be given to the best students, who will in return give back to the country."

# Mr. Zafar Masud Shares Life Journey at 15<sup>th</sup> Session of 'Leaders at LUMS'

## Why Your Donation Matters

For over three decades, our donors have supported the University's mission of providing world-class education to students, enabled ground-breaking research, and helped LUMS become a premier learner-centred institution.

#### **Inclusive and Accessible Education for All**

LUMS is a not-for-profit institution, with a strong focus on providing need blind admissions. With one in three students on financial aid, LUMS has disbursed PKR 7.8 billion through scholarships and the National Outreach Programme (NOP) since inception. The University conducts sessions to create awareness of its programmes in underserved areas throughout the country. Along with living stipends, we provide full tuition fee waivers and also cover the costs of books, hostels, lab facilities, etc. Applicants are also provided extra coaching as well as financial support for standardised academic tests.

#### **Immeasurable Impact on Business and Society**

We have 300 world-class faculty members contributing to global research and industry linkages. Centres at LUMS are working in areas ranging from water, energy, and big data to indigenous languages and public policy. The Suleman Dawood School of Business is the only business school in Pakistan to have earned the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB) international accreditation. The Mushtaq Ahmad Gurmani School of Humanities and Social Sciences has recently initiated a partnership with the University of East Anglia for a joint PhD programme. The Biomechanics Lab at the Syed Babar Ali School of Science and Engineering earned accreditation from ICC, making it the fifth in the world to earn such an accolade. The Shaikh Ahmad Hassan School of Law has established the first Centre for Chinese Legal Studies in Pakistan in alliance with the School of Law at Wuhan University in China. The Syed Ahsan Ali and Syed Maratib Ali School of Education has also been involved in multiple partnerships, making a significant impact on the educational landscape of the country.

#### LUMS Alumni Serve as Agents of Change

Our 15,578 alumni play a prominent role in contributing towards the development of the community. LUMS Alumni have seen great success and make up a significantly large group of Fulbright scholars in the world. Our graduates have also consistently scored the highest marks in the Central Superior Service examinations in Pakistan. Furthermore, they have shown a passionate commitment to serve the less fortunate. This reaffirms our belief that supporting one scholar today can make tremendous impact in the world tomorrow, not only for their families and communities, but also for the society at large.
