THE UNIVERSITY

LUMS is a not-for-profit organisation established in 1985. It has evolved into a leading institution for research and teaching, with its students and faculty working towards solving the grand challenges of South Asia and beyond.

LUMS offers a distinctive academic experience through its 'Learning Without Borders' philosophy, providing an integrated core curriculum across disciplines. Its five schools have nurtured leaders in all spheres of life ranging from entrepreneurship, economics, biology, mathematics, engineering, education, writing, politics and business.

The University's internationally qualified faculty are experts in their fields. They create an engaging learning environment and foster a mentoring relationship with their students, who are taken on as co-creators in this process. A major hallmark of the pedagogy at LUMS is that it encourages students to apply their knowledge and come up with progressive 21st century solutions. Academic Advising services at the University offer school focused peer-mentoring programmes, and online resources for faculty advisors and students.

Cutting-edge research at LUMS is positioned to examine the mission of higher education from the perspective of innovation, continuing education, and social engagement. The centres at LUMS work in areas ranging from water, energy, and entrepreneurship, to indigenous languages and public policy, among others. Research from faculty is published in prestigious publications all around the world, and their work also informs policymaking at national and regional levels.

Making the LUMS experience accessible to

bright students across the country regardless of their financial circumstances is a top commitment. As part of its National Outreach Programme, the University reaches out to over a hundred cities across Pakistan, attracting talent from underserved seaments of society. As a result, the University is home to scholars from diverse backgrounds and unique perspectives, offering an experience that expands horizons and encourages collaborations

LUMS has also ushered in a new era of learning in the region by offering interactive online learning models. Cloud classrooms coupled with personalised feedback from both the students and teachers shape the interactive model and enhance learning. LUMSx, a platform for open learning, allows faculty to reach students and teachers across the world. Massive



open online courses (MOOCs), webinars, and podcasts also offer creative ways for knowledge generation and dissemination to a global audience.

The well-being of its community members remains a major priority at LUMS. Several health and safety initiatives are in place, including therapy, counselling and meditation, and these provide constant and systematised support to students, staff and faculty.

LUMS continues to uphold high academic standards and its students, faculty and alumni are helping build a more sustainable and equitable society.

NOT-FOR-PROFIT STATUS

LUMS is a federally chartered university and is approved as a not-for-profit organisation under Section 2 (36) of Income Tax Ordinance, 2001 in terms of provisions of Clause 63 of Part IV of Second Schedule to the Ordinance. Any individual or organisation making donations to LUMS is entitled to a tax credit under Section 61 of Income Tax Ordinance, 2001. Moreover, the University has been granted exemption from the levy of income tax under Section 159 of the Ordinance, thus, tax is not deductible on payments made to the University.

FASCINATING **PAKISTAN**

Pakistan is the world's fifth-most populous nation, with almost 243 million people. The country is a dense mix of natives impacted by successive waves of migrations of Aryans, Persians, Greeks, Pashtuns, Mughals, and Arabs. With 73 languages spoken here, Pakistan is a rich amalgamation of history, culture, dialects, climates and terrain.

It is one of the few regions which annually experiences all four seasons. Located on the western end of the great Indo-Gangetic Plain, about three-fifths of Pakistan's area consists of rough mountainous terrain and plateaus, and the remaining two-fifths comprise a wide expanse of level plains. This diversity of

flora and fauna makes Pakistan an attractive tourist destination. The north is home to the mighty K2 and the Nanga Parbat, frequented by thousands of mountaineers each year. On the southwestern coast of Balochistan is the scenic city of Gwadar, located on the shores of the Arabian Sea.

Pakistan is a fertile land with many rivers. With a length of over 3,000 meters, River Indus is the longest river in Pakistan and also among the longest in the world. Five major





rivers run through the entire country and meet in the Punjab province, which is why it is called 'Panjaab', or the land of five rivers.

Most of the ancient Indus Valley civilization's important cities are in Pakistan. The region was the realm of multiple empires and dynasties, including Alexander the Great; the Mughals, the Sikh Empire, British East India Company, and most recently, the British Indian Empire. The state of Pakistan came into existence in 1947 by an act of the British Parliament.

While Karachi is Pakistan's largest city and financial centre, Lahore is its cultural capital and the centre of Pakistani higher education. The oldest educational institution of Pakistan, the University of ancient Takshshila in Taxila, dates to the 10th century BC and was attended by many Buddhist and Indian scholars.



GETTING TO KNOW LAHORE

Situated on the banks of the River Ravi, Lahore, has seen the comings and goings of many kings, emperors and rulers from different cultures and backgrounds and has absorbed these diverse influences achieving a unique sense of history.

The city is known for its historical monuments and its countless poets, scholars, writers, intellectuals and scientists. Standing tall in the heart of the city is the grand Lahore Fort, the magnificent Badshahi Mosque, Minar-e-Pakistan and the Sheesh Mahal - a UNESCO recognised world heritage site.

The people of Lahore like to claim that "One who has not seen Lahore has not lived." Lahoris are friendly, generous and hospitable, and their zest for life and food is well-known. Accordingly, the city is famed for its wide variety and styles of foods. Food streets in Androon Lahore (old city) are popular junctions for traditional food dishes, while restaurants and cafes offering continental as well as local dishes, and international food franchises can be found across the city.

Lahore offers a harmonious blend of tradition and modernism. There are vibrant malls offering brands from across the world, an efficient public transport system that takes you to all parts of the city, and a host of social activities all year round, which include arts and crafts exhibitions, film and literature festivals, music concerts and much more.

OUR SCHOOLS

Through rigorous programming and an emphasis on research and scholarship, the five Schools at LUMS provide students with a rich educational environment.

Faculty work closely with students, who curate and customise their educational trajectory. They can choose from a variety of degrees at the undergraduate, graduate and doctoral levels and can pick courses from different Schools and Departments. The wide range of choices allows each student to develop a holistic approach towards their field of study and this transdisciplinary approach is key to innovation and discovery at LUMS.



SULEMAN DAWOOD School of Business (SDSB)

SDSB has gained international acclaim over three decades. As Pakistan's first business school to have earned the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB) international accreditation, SDSB offers its students leading-edge business and management education.

AACSB has featured SDSB in its Innovations That Inspire member spotlight programme. The School has received this honourable recognition for its Women's Scholarship Initiative, which offers a 50% tuition fee waiver to all women admitted to its graduate programmes. The initiative has also been awarded the Best of Asia-Pacific in the Leadership -Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Initiative by the Council for Advancement and Support of Education based in Washington. SDSB, through this initiative, aims to promote gender diversity and produce

highly skilled graduates who can lead, transform and create a long-lasting impact in business and society.

According to QS World University Rankings, SDSB is ranked number one in Pakistan for Business and Management Studies. Its Accounting and Finance programme has a global ranking of 201-250 and is the first to be ranked in this subject area in the country. SDSB is the only school from Pakistan to be ranked in the **QS Global MBA Rankings** and its MBA is ranked among the top 30 MBA programmes in Asia and the top 201+ in the world.

Pioneer of the case method of learning in Pakistan, SDSB adds blended and experiential learning to its pedagogy. The School is also a Harvard Publishing Content Partner and has one of the largest collections of indigenous business case studies in South Asia.

Cutting-edge research is a hallmark of the School, and faculty members have extensive business and consultancy experience. Students can engage with senior executives from the private and public sectors, as well as entrepreneurs. This provides them with a practical perspective on contemporary business topics as well as networking opportunities with potential employers.

In addition to its flagship MBA, the Executive MBA and a PhD in Management, SDSB also offers MS programmes to address the needs of specialised sectors in the region. Through these offerings, SDSB is changing both thought and practice whilst imparting outstanding business education and mobilising positive social change.



MUSHTAQ AHMAD GURMANI SCHOOL OF HUMANITIES AND SOCIAL SCIENCES (MGSHSS)

MGSHSS is reshaping the way social sciences and humanities are taught in Pakistan. The School offers a comprehensive liberal arts curriculum. It consists of two departments: Economics, and Humanities and Social Sciences The Department of Economics at MGSHSS is one of the most established in Pakistan, with 21 faculty members who hold PhDs. The School also has a partnership with the University of East Anglia for a joint PhD programme in Economics

The innovative curriculum at MGSHSS provides a broad foundation of knowledge to its students as they delve into works on politics, scientific reasoning, sociology, economics, culture, religion, art, literature, and aesthetics.

Equipped with a diverse set of transferable skills, students are able to overcome challenges in a rapidly changing world, whether they have to work in the public sector, the private sector, for non-governmental organisations, or in academia.

The international reputation of the School continues to grow and gain recognition through its research. Its faculty members have authored over 40 academic publications and five books in the past year.

They have published in internationally acclaimed presses such as Hurst, Oxford, Cambridge, Routledge, McGill, and Palgrave Macmillan. Their work is also published in the highest rated journals in their respective fields, including South Asia Development, International Review of

Fconomics and Finance. Development Effectiveness, Labour Economics, Global South and Research in African Literature

Several alumni have distinguished themselves in a variety of fields and have been recognised at the annual Vice Chancellor's Alumni Achievement Awards. The work done at MGSHSS continues to push the boundaries of scholarship and is helping create a comprehensive understanding of South Asia and its complexities.



SYED BABAR ALI SCHOOL OF SCIENCE AND **ENGINEERING (SBASSE)**

Practising a 'no-boundaries' philosophy, SBASSE is making significant strides in the experimentation of teaching and learning, while celebrating the novelty of research. Through innovative and impactful contributions to science and technology. SBASSE is nurturing future leaders with the potential to impact society.

SBASSE faculty and students conduct groundbreaking research and develop solutions to the most complex local and global problems. The curriculum is designed to encourage cross-disciplinary collaborations between the various disciplines at SBASSE, as well as those offered by other schools at LUMS

SBASSE offers four-year undergraduate Bachelor of Science degrees in basic sciences as well as

Computer Science, Electrical Engineering, Mathematics, and Chemical Engineering. It also offers a joint major in Economics and Mathematics The School has robust MS and PhD programmes in various disciplines-all designed to train an ambitious group of scientists and researchers.

According to the OS World University Rankings 2022, subjects at SBASSE have been highly ranked.

The School's faculty have won international awards for their research, and have produced around 300 articles, all published in international venues of prestigious ranking.

Recently, the World Bank and the Higher Education Commission Pakistan. awarded the School a PKR 12 million Rapid Research Grant to study how humans respond to the COVID-19 infection. A team of researchers at the School have also secured a grant of PKR 210 million for a sustainability project that uses technological innovations and data driven policymaking.



SHAIKH AHMAD HASSAN School of Law (Sahsol)

The 5-year BA-LL.B degree at SAHSOL is conceded by the Pakistan Bar Council and the Higher Education Commission, Pakistan. The two-year BA phase of the degree is interdisciplinary and exposes students to a wide range of disciplines across LUMS. The three-year LL.B phase requires students to undertake fundamental and specialised courses in law.

The curriculum at SAHSOL has been carefully designed to ensure key learning objectives about core areas of the law. Students can choose from a diverse set of elective courses. organised in five course streams; Government, Law and Citizenship, Criminal Law, Business Law, Legal Theory, and International and Comparative Law. The Socratic Method employed at the School engages students in dynamic discussions that enhance their critical thinking and analytical reasoning skills.

In addition to learning in the classroom, real-world training is an important component of this degree. Law majors have multiple opportunities to undertake legal internships, contribute to the LUMS Law Journal, and engage in pro bono work through the Street Law Programme.

Students are provided with career guidance through the Advisement Cell at the School and the Alumni Mentorship Programme. The Legal Writing Lab also provides advice on students' analytical, critical, and persuasive writing skills.

SAHSOL's faculty have published books with international publishers and have had their work included in major law reviews and journals. Through various initiatives, the faculty actively works towards making an impact both locally and internationally. Some notable projects are with the American Bar Association. the Lahore High Court's historic judgement to end the 'Two Finger Test' in rape case investigations in Punjab, participation in the Committee for Welfare of the Prisoners and Improvements in Prisons System of the Punjab and trainings for the Khyber-Pakhtunkhwa Women's Parliamentary Caucus. The School also hosts the Centre for Chinese Legal Studies, a collaboration with Wuhan University in China.

SAHSOL graduates have gained recognition as leaders in the corporate sector, partners in top law firms, as well as advocates for a range of public interest causes. They have also excelled in the Central Superior Services exams. Many graduates have gone on to pursue higher education at top universities around the world, receiving prestigious scholarships.



SYED AHSAN ALI AND SYED MARATIB ALI SCHOOL OF EDUCATION (SOE)

Through its comprehensive programmes, SOE produces strategic leaders, policy researchers, and reflective practitioners who are geared towards directing a vibrant education reform agenda for Pakistan.

The School offers three interdisciplinary minors in education, an MPhil in Education Leadership and Management and a weekendbased Executive MPhil in Education Leadership and Management. The programmes feature extensive field engagement and operate at the nexus of research, policy and practice.

MPhil candidates participate in the Practicum Programme, a mandatory, intensive semester long 'residency' rooted in field-based research during which students are placed in one of the 46 educational organisations that have partnered with SOE. The School also helps students reach their full potential through the numerous individual interviews, advising sessions and networking events conducted by the SOE Career Placement Programme.

The School provides Professional Education solutions to educators in various stages of their careers. The solutions are offered at the individual level through courses, trainings, workshops and certifications, as well as at the organisational level through custom programmes.

Faculty at SOE actively engages at the national level. They are part of the government's education task forces, boards of publicprivate partnerships, and autonomous bodies in the government. They also lead policy roundtables with multiple stakeholders on issues of national importance.

With graduates that are wellequipped to diagnose and solve real-world problems in public and private schools, SOE is well on its way to create sustainable and much needed change in classrooms across Pakistan.

LIFE AT LUMS

Students at LUMS are encouraged to pursue their passions and try new things. LUMS is the perfect place to experience campus life with 55 clubs and societies that offer something that piques everyone's interest – from sports to social work, arts to app making.

These societies offer students a place to express themselves. learn new skills, and meet like-minded people. They also provide them the opportunity to represent the country at international forums. Many of our student delegations have made a mark at prestigious competitions such as Model United Nations, and the Jessup International Law Moot Court Competition. The University also offers various sports activities and programmes to keep its community members physically and mentally fit.

Students have the choice to consider optional curricular opportunities: free electives or minors, independent study, semester abroad at an international university, senior projects, research and many other opportunities. This variety of additional choices can enable each student at LUMS to create a unique academic experience for themselves.

Experiential learning stands out as a distinctive feature of learning at LUMS, highlighted by internships, practicums, pedagogical partnerships, and the more recent, one-of-a-kind twinning programme with the University of Baltistan in Skardu.

The Pedagogical Partnership Programme offered at LUMS is the first of its kind in South Asia and provides students with paid partnerships. These involve active collaboration with faculty and staff to design courses, offer feedback on teaching, engage in research and work directly with service units on campus. Meanwhile, the inclusive environment at LUMS fosters a strong sense of community in its members, which makes for a dynamic university experience.

No matter where students come from, or where they are headed, at LUMS they will find a home and a community that will encourage, support and inspire.







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THE CAMPUS AND FACILITIES

The 100-acre, modern LUMS campus is a beautiful place, where one lays the groundwork for lifelong connections and friendships.

From physical to mental health, well-being is a priority at the University. The Syed Maratib Ali Sports Complex and the Coca-Cola Aquatic Centre offer stateof-the-art sports facilities that help students maintain an active lifestyle.

The Counselling and Psychological Services has therapists on board, working under the supervision of a licensed clinical psychologist, to meet the mental health demands of the community. In addition, the Health and Wellness Centre on campus is equipped to provide emergency medical services to all.

The dining experience at LUMS is carefully curated to cater to all kinds of taste buds. From organic fruits at the LUMS Store, and Pakistani food and barbeque, to Lebanese cuisine and salads, everything is available on campus.

The seven male and six female hostels at the University offer a

friendly and secure environment to all students and are furnished with a wide range of amenities including Wi-Fi, TV lounges, game rooms, laundry rooms, kitchens and dining rooms. A dedicated staff member is also available to help students at all times.

The Gad and Birgit Rausing Library at LUMS offers an outstanding learning experience. Students can access a wide range of print collections and online services including subscriptions to print and online journals, as well as e-libraries.

Furthermore, the new custombuilt LUMS Daycare Centre offers separate areas specially designed for infants, pre-schoolers and school-going children, in addition to an outdoor play area and other facilities. The Daycare offers a homegrown curriculum designed by the LUMS School of Education students with activities that are aimed to enhance social, motor and creative skills.

RESEARCH AND

Faculty at LUMS conduct multidisciplinary research to expand human knowledge and address global challenges. Working side-by-side with students, they advance scholarship in the realm of climate change, digital literacy, poverty, energy, agriculture and many other fields.

In the past academic year, LUMS faculty won 108 external grants worth PKR 624 million and 113 internal grants worth PKR 80 million. Research has been conducted in areas as diverse as battery electric vehicles, controlling drought stress in plants to preserve crop production, affordable housing, development of an international refugee curriculum and design for teaching computational thinking and STEM.

Faculty at the University are regularly published in topranked academic journals, and they collaborate with high-ranking think tanks, policymakers, government committees, and leading research institutes around the world. Books, edited volumes, and case studies by faculty members are also used across mainstream academics and for trainings at national institutions.

They have also received numerous awards and grants from organisations such as Facebook, Google, The World Bank and UNHCR - The UN Refugee Agency — a testament to the quality of their research.


CENTRES AT LUMS

Exciting discoveries are made and new scholarship is created at the Centres at LUMS through a synergistic relationship between theory and practice.

The LUMS Learning Institute

transforms learning and teaching practices by utilising modern technologies and innovative teaching tools. It also connects students with faculty to establish valuable pedagogical partnerships. The Centre has been instrumental in developing LUMSx - the new digital platform for open courses, encouraging interinstitutional collaboration, and national and regional partnerships.

The LUMS Energy Institute

works with the energy and power sector of Pakistan. It provides interdisciplinary research and shares capacity building practices, which support power and energy planning, renewable energy technologies, and grid modernisation.

The Rausing Executive Development Centre imparts

executive education to enable managers to progress into leaders, following both case-based teaching and hybrid pedagogies. The Centre is recognised for its transformative learning experiences impacting individual and organisational performances.

The Gurmani Centre for Languages and Literature

was established in 2010 for the advancement of South Asian languages and literature. The Centre achieves this aim through language teaching, research and publications, as well as cultural programming.

The National Centre in Big Data and Cloud

Computing partners with 11 universities working on big data across areas of agriculture, industry, energy, health, multimedia and local languages. The Centre also hosts Pakistan's open data portal and focuses on human resource development in the specialised field of big data and cloud computing and its practical applications.

The Centre for Water Informatics and Technology

conducts research and works closely with industry and the government on developing technologies to improve irrigation efficiency and introduce sustainable agricultural practices. The LUMS Centre for Entrepreneurship has a focus

on contributing to Pakistan's economic development by promoting innovation and entrepreneurship in high impact areas. It inspires and facilitates problem-solvers in agriculture, education, environment, financial inclusion, healthcare, and applications utilising artificial intelligence and machine learning.

The Centre for Continuing Education Studies offers

courses that develop the professional expertise of students, professionals and non traditional learners. Its courses are designed and delivered by highly acclaimed industry experts and academics.

The Saida Waheed Gender

Initiative leverages research. teaching, and praxis related to gender at LUMS. It encourages research and resource development supporting pedagogy in the area of gender studies. The initiative hosts events

that bring together scholars, students, and members of the broader community.

The Centre for Chinese

Legal Studies promotes the teaching of Chinese laws in Pakistan. It aims to become a regional hub for shared legal resources between Pakistan and China. Academics. students, and legal and business professionals in both countries are facilitated to exchange knowledge and build capacity and legal expertise through the Centre.

The Centre for Business and Society is a platform for debates, policy discussions, student engagement and events to engender positive societal impact. This impact is created by providing a critical forum for discussion on focus areas vital to Pakistan's social and economic sustainability.

The Mahbub ul Hag Research Centre supports interdisciplinary research, scholarship and teaching on issues of human development, social exclusion and inequality across South Asia

The Technology for People

Initiative was established to explore and enhance sustainable, innovative and low cost technology. It aims to make government institutions in Pakistan as informed. inclusive and responsive as possible to achieve good governance.

Focused on providing talented students with a world-class education, one in three students at LUMS is on some form of financial aid.

Undergraduate students at LUMS can avail a variety of financial assistance programmes:

- 100 merit scholarships for top-ranked applicants on admission evaluation ranking
- Need-based tuition fee waivers and LUMS interestfree loans
- Sekha Scholarship which offers 100% scholarships

- for the top five applicants inducted to Syed Babar Ali School of Science and Engineering
- Shahid Hussain Foundation Scholarship for nationals of SAARC member countries (excluding Pakistani applicants)
- The National Outreach Programme Scholarship that provides full funding to local applicants, including a complete tuition waiver, free hostel accommodation, and a stipend

Generous scholarships are available to all graduate students admitted to LUMS:

- Merit scholarships for top applicants for all graduate programmes across the University
- Interest-free loans that cover partial to full tuition fee expenses
- Four Basic Sciences Awards for the MS programmes in Biology, Physics, Chemistry, and Mathematics
- A 50% tuition fee waiver to all female students admitted to graduate programmes at the Suleman Dawood School of Business
- PhD students at the Syed Babar Ali School of Science and Engineering are provided a full tuition fee waiver for four years
- Option to work as Research or Teaching Assistants

The National Outreach Programme (NOP) is an embodiment of LUMS' core principles of diversity and accessibility. The Programme is the global winner of the Platinum Award by the Council for Advancement and Support for Education (CASE) 2021 for 'Best Practices in Diversity, Equity and Inclusion'. The NOP is a unique initiative making guality education accessible to those belonging to underserved areas across Pakistan, To date, 1.384 students have been recruited from 145 cities, towns and villages.

The NOP offers up to 140% scholarship, which covers tuition, books, living stipends, and lodging. The impact of the scholarship on the scholars and their communities is far-reaching; many of them become the first to graduate in their families and are able to avail worthwhile academic and professional opportunities.

Since its inception in 2001, 926 NOP students have graduated; 52 of them have received scholarships in top universities worldwide while others are at good positions in international companies. Remarkably, many NOP graduates have been inspired to launch local enterprises that create sustainable social impact in their communities creating a multiplier effect across the country.

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We are grateful to our remarkable alumni and donor community for strengthening the LUMS' tradition of creating opportunity and access for students across the country. Here are the patrons who have extended their invaluable support to the University over the years.

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Donating towards LUMS Financial Aid and the National Outreach Programme (NOP) will help Pakistan's most talented students bring their dreams to life. You can choose to donate once annually or create a named endowment that can provide financial assistance to many students over the fund's lifetime.

Donations will go towards awarding scholarships disbursed through various means. The NOP scholarship consists of a complete tuition fee waiver and additional stipends for hostel accommodation, reading materials, and a living allowance. Graduate programme scholarships are awarded as interest-free loans, and undergraduate programme financial aid scholars receive a combination of up to 70% support, including waivers and interest-free loans.

Admission to all programmes is purely on merit and independent of students' ability to pay the fees. Each academic year, all aid is reassessed based on performance, financial need, available resources, and general university policies. Students are required to start paying their LUMS interest-free loans six months after graduation, completing all payments within three to five years.
