Sample Questions for Verbal & Math Sections

Test Duration: 2 hours 40 minutes

All applicants must bring the following two items to the Test Center. Otherwise, they will not be allowed to take the LCAT.

- 1. Printed signed copy of the Test Registration Slip &**
- 2. Photo bearing Valid CNIC/Government-issued Juvenile card/ Passport. No other form of identity will be accepted.**

The LCAT is a multiple-choice test like the SAT. However, the time duration and test format may vary from the SAT. The sample questions are general guidelines to help test takers prepare for the LCAT.

General Guidelines for Preparing the Verbal Sections of the LCAT

To excel in the verbal sections, which combine elements of both reading and writing of the LCAT, a comprehensive and strategic approach is crucial. Firstly, immerse yourself in diverse reading materials. This will enhance your understanding of various writing styles, themes, and vocabularies. Practice regularly with sample passages, identifying central ideas, analyzing arguments, and discerning the author's purpose.

For the writing component, hone your skills in constructing clear, coherent arguments and using evidence effectively. Attention to grammar, syntax, and word choice to improve precision and style. Time management is key; practice under timed conditions to develop the ability to quickly comprehend texts and articulate responses. Lastly, familiarize yourself with the test format and question types through SAT practice tests to build confidence and reduce test-day anxiety.

Recent statistics show a remarkable increase in the number of young voters, rising to 56.86 million from 46.43 million in the last six years. This surge represents a substantial 22.5% increase, suggesting a dynamic shift in the electoral landscape.

The total voter count now stands at 128.58 million, with young voters comprising 44.22% of this number.
