ADMISSION CRITERIA

Admission is purely merit-based and rests solely on the following criteria:

- Academic Record
- Performance in Admission Test
- Minimum 2 years of work experience (mandatory for those applying to the Weekend Track for Executives)
- Curriculum Vitae (CV)
- Online Application Submission
- Online Submission of Supporting Documents and Fee Payment
- Letters of Recommendation (2 letters required)
- Application Review
- Interview Performance (if shortlisted)

Note: These are the minimum criteria applicants must fulfil to be eligible to apply. Meeting these criteria does not guarantee admission to LUMS.
