- Recognizes up to 5 LUMS instructors each year
- Must have 5 + years teaching at LUMS
- Nominated by a colleague, administrator, student, staff
- Submit portfolios of evidence of teaching excellence impact on student learning
- LLI offers resources and workshops to help develop your Award's Portfolio
- Call for Nomination Mid December
- Full Portfolios due Mid April
- Winners announced in May
- Award includes individual (or) group grants for pedagogical projects, announcement at convocation, invitation to annual winner's retreat

Elements of a Teaching Dossier

Typical length: 6-12 pages

Maximum length including appendices: 35-50 pages

What is a teaching dossier?

A teaching dossier is a combination of documents - narrative descriptions of teaching, sample teaching materials and teaching evaluations - that highlights and summarizes your teaching experience. A strong dossier is concise and selective. It is also authentic, sincere, well-written and well-organized. An effective teaching dossier should provide a snapshot of you as a teacher that allows a reader to identify your own approach to teaching and how you value student learning.

"University reviews will carefully evaluate a candidate's record of excellence in teaching, using the six university-wide criteria for teaching effectiveness."1 (p. 9)

LUMS Six Criteria for evaluating Teaching:

- Design and planning of learning activities
- Teaching and supporting student learning
- Assessment and giving feedback to students on their learning 4. Developing effective learning environments, student support and guidance
- 5. Integration of scholarship, research and professional activities with teaching and in support of tudent learning
- 6. Evaluation of practice and continuing professional development

The five schools have developed indicators and list of evidence to demonstrate teaching excellence. It highly encouraged that you look at your schools' indicators and map your personal examples of evidence of effectiveness onto the indicators that apply to your case.
